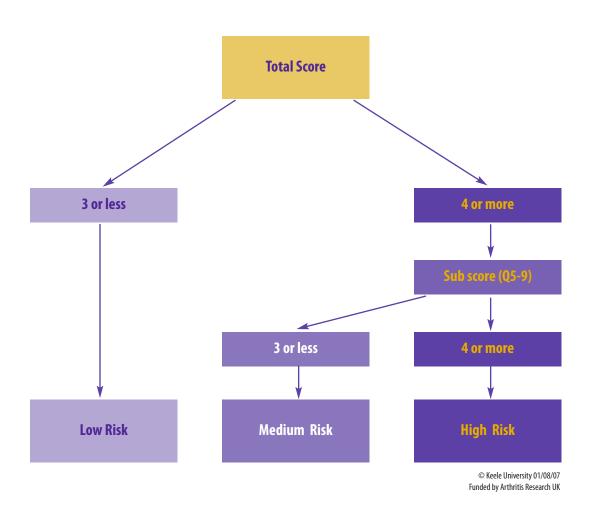
LOW BACK PAIN STRATEGY The Keele STarT Back Screening Tool
